- We use \_\_\_\_\_ to talk about possible situations, things that may easily happen.
- We use \_\_\_\_\_ to talk about things that are generally true, especially for laws and rules and general habits.
- We use \_\_\_\_\_ to talk about unrealistic or unreal situations.

## Structure

### Zero conditional

We use: **When/if +** \_\_\_\_\_ , \_\_\_\_\_.

### First conditional

We use: **If +** \_\_\_\_\_ , \_\_\_\_\_ + verb.

### Second conditional

We use: **If +** \_\_\_\_\_ , \_\_\_\_\_ + infinitive.

## Practice
