A. GRAMMAR - COMPARATIVE ADJECTIVES (So sánh hơn với tính từ):

- **Cách dùng:** So sánh hơn thường được sử dụng cho việc so sánh 2 hay nhiều vật/người với nhau.
- **Cấu trúc:**

Tính từ ngắn	S1 (chủ ngữ 1) + to be + short adj-er + than + S2 (chủ ngữ 2). ex: Bikes are slower than cars. (Xe đạp chậm hơn xe ô tô.)
Tính từ dài	S1 (chủ ngữ 1) + to be + more + long adj + than + S2 (chủ ngữ 2). ex: A lion is more dangerous than an elephant. (Sư tử nguy hiểm hơn voi.)

* Lưu ý 1:

- Tính từ ngắn là các tính từ có một âm tiết.
- Tính từ dài là tính từ có từ 2 âm tiết trở lên. (Bỏ qua trường hợp từ có 2 âm tiết được gọi là tính từ ngắn).

* Lưu ý 2:

1. Tính từ hai âm tiết tận cùng bằng -er, -le, -ow, -et thì coi là tính từ ngắn.	simple – simpler narrow – narrower
2. Tính từ có đuôi -y , chuyển -y thành -i rồi thêm -er .	dirty – dirtier happy – happier
3. Với tính từ ngắn, nếu trước phụ âm cuối là một nguyên âm thì gấp đôi phụ âm cuối.	big – bigger sad – sadder

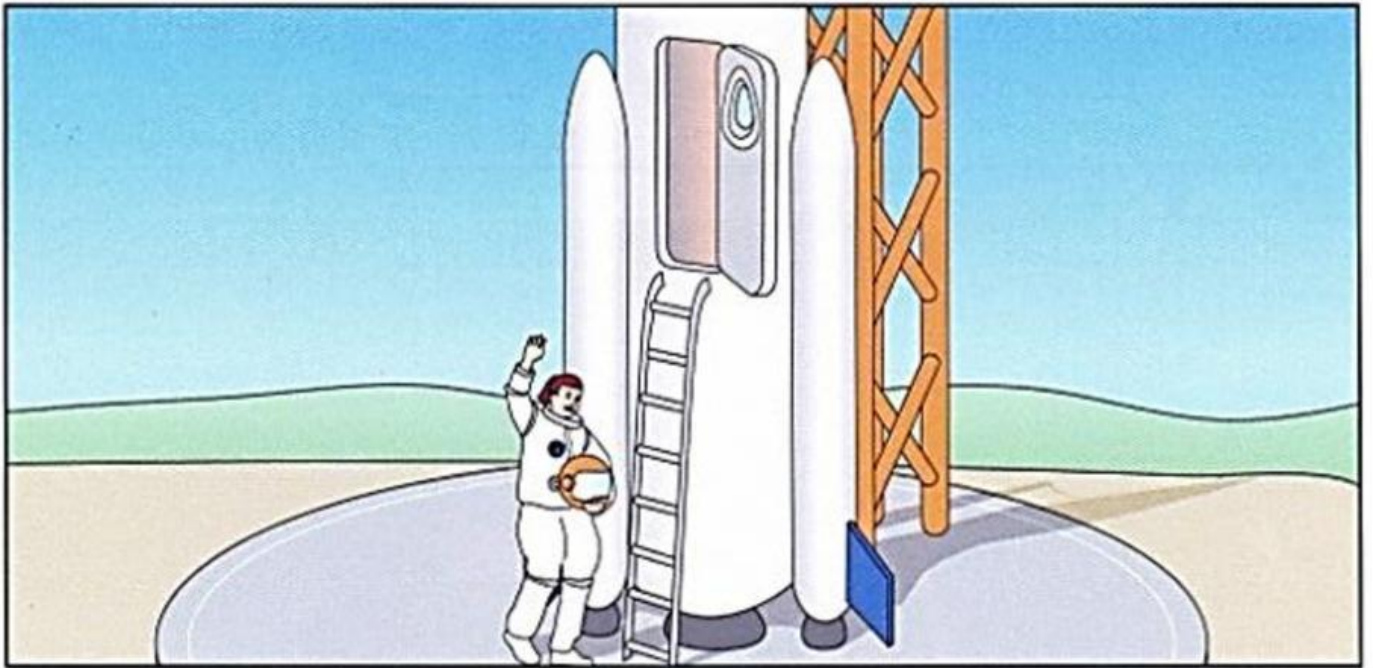
