THE CAUSES AND EFFECTS OF FLOODS

1 Floods occur when water covers land that is usually dry. 2 This essay will explore some of the causes of floods, and their short-term and long-term effects.

3 Flooding has a wide range of causes. 4 The most common is excessive rainfall, which makes the water level of a river rise until it overflows its banks. 5 An earthquake on the ocean floor can also cause a flood because it sometimes starts a huge wave called a tsunami. 6 Other causes are due to human activity. 7 Concrete laid on the earth's surface, for example, leads to rainwater running across the ground rather than down into it. 8 Cutting down trees contributes to flooding, too, because the leaves of trees can hold a lot of rainwater. 9 Without trees, much more rainwater reaches the ground.

10 Whatever the cause of a flood, its effects can be very damaging in the short term. 11 It can result in the destruction of buildings, possessions, and crops. 12 It can even kill people. 13 In the longer term, it can be difficult to grow crops on farmland that has been flooded with salt water. 14 However, river floodwater can have a more positive long-term effect. 15 It often carries rich soil onto farmland, which can help crops to grow.
