3. Use a capital letter for the “I”

4. Use a capital letter for days of the week, months of the year, holidays:

- Monday, Tuesday
- January, February
- Christmas

5. Use a capital letter for countries, languages & nationalities, religions:

- China, France
- Japanese, English
- Christianity, Buddhism

6. Use a capital letter for trade-marks and names of companies and other organizations:

- Pepsi Cola, Walkman
- Microsoft Corporation, Toyota
- the United Nations, the Red Cross

7. Use a capital letter for places and monuments:

- London, Paris, the Latin Quarter
- the Eiffel Tower, St Paul's Cathedral
- Buckingham Palace, the White House
- Oxford Street, Fifth Avenue
- Jupiter, Mars, Sirius
- Asia, the Middle East, the North Pole
