- Animals can be sorted into two main groups: **vertebrates** and **invertebrates**.

• Animals with Backbones: Vertebrates

- **Vertebrates** are sorted into small groups by their characteristics:
 - **Amphibians**: have moist skin. Have (Young amphibians, like tadpoles, use to breathe). Lay eggs in water.
 - **Birds**: have feathers. Have lungs. Have Can fly. Lay eggs with hard shells.
 - **Fish**: have scales. Have Lay eggs in water.
 - **Mammals**: have hairy Have lungs. Give birth live young. Produce milk.
 - **Reptiles**: have dry scales. Have lungs. Lay eggs on land.
