

EVER VS NEVER

Ever

It means "at any time." One of its uses is in questions:

- Have you **ever** seen a double rainbow?
- Has Jim **ever** been late for work?
- Have Julie and her boyfriend **ever** had a fight?

Never

It means "not at any time." Its main use is in negative statements:

- They've **never** arrived late.
- She's **never** fought with her boyfriend.
- Bob's **never** smoked.
