# The Ocarina part 2

#### When was the modern ocarina created?

In 1853, 17-year-old Guiseppi Donati from Bologna, Italy created the modern-day ocarina. He gave it the name ocarina which means "little goose".

### Ocarina - further developments.

In 1963, Englishman John Taylor, a 23-year-old drop out from the Royal Academy of Music, developed a fingering system that allowed a 4-hole ocarina to play a full chromatic octave (12 notes). This gave performers a greater flexibility as they could now access a wider range of notes resulting in a wider range of melodies.

## How many notes can an ocarina play at the one time?

Most ocarinas only play one note at a time. However, some multi-chamber ocarinas can play more than one note at the same time.
