O Definition

Narrative text is an imaginative story or a fiction story.

O Purpose

It is to entertain the readers.

- O Language Features
 - Past tense (masa lampau)
 - Action verbs (V2/kata kerja kedua): co. walked, went, said etc.
 - Adverbs of time (keterangan waktu): once upon a time, one day, a long time ago etc.
- O Generic Structure
 - Orientation: It introduces characters and informs the setting of place and time.
 - Complication: It tells the problems of the story.
 - Resolution: The problems in the story solved, for better or worse (happy ending or sad ending).
 - Reorientation (optional): Lesson or moral value from the story.
