## Relative clauses: DEFINING AND NON-DEFINING

Relative clauses give us information about the person or thing mentioned.

Defining relative clauses give us ESSENTIAL information about someone or something information that we need in order to understand what or who is being referred to.

Non-defining relative clauses give us EXTRA information about someone or something. It isn't essential for understanding who or what we are talking about.

## Warning:

The relative pronouns WHO, WHICH, and WHOSE can all be used in non-defining relative clauses. However, THAT is only used in defining relative clauses.
