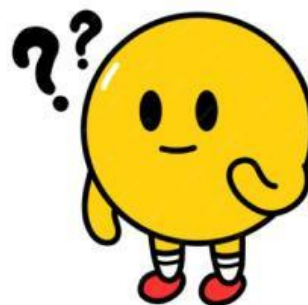

BRITISH FAMILY VALUES
