What's a Sentence?

A sentence is a group of words that tell one complete idea.

What's a Run-on Sentence?

A run-on sentence is a group of words that <u>smashes 2 sentences together</u>.

Nothing connects the 2 sentences.

Here are 2 ways to fix 2 sentences that have been smashed together:

- 1) Connect the 2 sentences with connector words like "and" or "but."
 He likes cats he doesn't like dogs. ==> He likes cats, but he doesn't like dogs.
- 2) Separate the sentences. Put a period at the end of the first sentence.

 Start the second sentence with a capital (big) letter.

 He likes cats he doesn't like dogs. ==> He likes cats. He doesn't like dogs.
