## Who did it?

1 Choose the correct words to complete the text.

Three nights ago, there were two <sup>1</sup>*thefts / robberies* in the houses along my street. In the first case, the only thing that was <sup>2</sup>*robbed / stolen* was a single shoe. In the second case, it was a child's teddy bear. No windows or doors were broken, and none of the <sup>3</sup>*suspects / victims* saw or heard anything before, during or after the <sup>4</sup>*burglaries / robberies* took place.

The police <sup>5</sup>*arrested / suspected* a local man who was often in trouble with the law. They <sup>6</sup>*arrested / sentenced* him and took him to the police station, but let him go a few hours later because he could prove he was at home with his family.

The next night, a ball of wool disappeared from another house on the street, and the owner of a fourth house reported a missing glove. The owner of the last house heard something on the roof, but by the time he got out of bed to investigate, the criminal had <sup>7</sup>*escaped / sentenced*.
