

 **Too Many, Too Much, and Very**

Too many and **too much** are quantifying expressions. We use them when we talk about quantities. We use **too many** for countable nouns and **too much** for uncountable nouns. We use one of these expressions when there is more than enough of something.



She makes **too much** noise.



There are **too many** apples in the basket.



He spends **too much** time in front of the TV.



There are **too many** cars on the street.

When we want to emphasize something, we use **very**. We use **very** with adjectives.



It is **very** cold outside.



The box is **very** heavy.
