Whose and possessive pronouns

Ask about possessors with whose.
Whose cap is this? It's John's.
Whose headphones are these? They're Fiona's.
Use possessive pronouns to talk about who things belong to.
It's Catherine's handbag. → It's **hers**.
It's my parents' car. → It's **theirs**.

Subject pronoun	Possessive adjective	Possessive pronoun
I	my	my/mine
you	your	your/yours
he	his	his/his
she	her	her/hers
it	its	its/its
we	our	our/ours
you	your	your/yours
they	their	their/theirs

Use possessive s with people's names.

They're **Jack's**.
If there are two or more people, only add possessive s to the last person.
It's **Harry and Sally's**.
