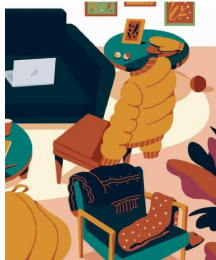
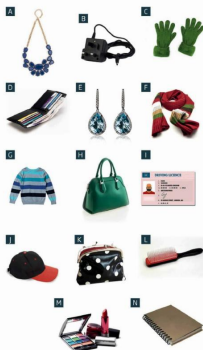

Ask about possession with **whose**.
Whose cap is this? It's John's.
 Whose hair gloves are these? They're Fiona's.
 Use possessive pronouns to talk about who things belong to.
 It's Catherine's handbag. → It's **hers**.
 It's my parents' car. → It's **theirs**.

Subject pronoun	Possessive adjective	Possessive pronoun
I	my	mine
you	your	yours
he	his	his
she	her	hers
it	its	its
we	our	ours
you	your	yours
they	their	theirs

Use possessive 's with people's names.
 They're Jack's.
 If there are two or more people, only add possessive 's to the last person.
 It's Harry and Sally's.

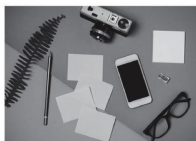
