Trick or Treating

Another popular Halloween tradition is 'trick or treating'. This began in the nineteenth century, and was an Irish tradition. Irish 12 brought 'trick or treating' to the United States. Today children and teenagers go 'trick or treating' in the evening. They visit their 13houses in their costumes. When the door opens they say 'Trick or treat?' People usually give them sweets or money. But when people don't give them a treat, the children play a 14 They sometimes write on 15 with soap or even throw an egg at the front door of the house.

Jack-o-lantern.

It is a popular tradition in the USA to buy a big pumpkin and make a jack-o'-lantern. People put their jack-o'-lanterns in front of the windows of their homes or in their gardens. This tradition originated in Great Britain and 9, when people wanted to frighten evil 10 But they didn't use pumpkins then: they used big 11 In the United States there weren't any turnips, so people used pumpkins.
