If I eat too many sweets, I will feel sick.

If she eats too many sweets, she will feel sick.

If we don't have any money, we won't go to the concert.

If he doesn't have any money, he won't go to the concert.

Will you answer the phone if it rings ?

Will she answer the phone if it rings ?



Will you dance if I  
play my new song?
