Lake



A great body of water that covers much of the Earth's surface. It is usually found between continents. It is salt water.

River



A large body of water that is surrounded by land. It is a very important source of freshwater.

Stream



A small area of still, fresh water. It is different from a river or a stream because it does not have moving water and it differs from a lake because it has a small area.

Ocean



A body of water that is shorter than a river. It needs both gravity and water to exist.
