#### WHAT'S WRONG WITH MY MONSTERA?

*Why aren't my monstera leaves splitting?*

When you think of monstera, you probably think of the characteristic leaf holes that set monstera apart from other plants. So it can be really frustrating when your leaves won't split!

There are usually two reasons for this.

First, your plant might be too young. Monstera leaves typically won't split until they're 2–3 years old, so if you have a young plant, be patient! Continue to take great care of your plant and you'll be rewarded!

The other reason is that your plant might not be getting enough light. If your older monstera isn't producing holes, move it to an area with bright, indirect sunlight, and consider supplementing with a grow light if your home doesn't get enough sunlight.



What do light brown spots on monstera leaves mean?

If the edges of your monstera turn a light brown color, your plant might be thirsty! If the soil feels dry, give it a drink and consider watering a little more than usual. You can trim off the dead edges, because they won't heal.

For this DIY you'll need:

- ♥ Sharp Knife
- ♥ Shape of a Monstera leaf printed out or drawn.
- ♥ Cutting Mat
- ♥ Glue
- ♥ Green Acrylic Paint
- ♥ Plexiglass (can be as thick as you want)



First draw or print out a shape of a monstera leaf of your liking. Keep in mind that the more details it has, the more complicated it will be to cut out.

Then trace the leaf to the plexiglass. I used a knife to carve it in lightly, but you can also use a marker.

Later it's time to use a knife to cut it out, carve it in and break off the remains carefully. Which can be tricky (mine broke at some spots I didn't wanted it to).

Finally, mix glue with a tiny bit of green paint. You could test the colour first on one of the scrap pieces to see if you like it. If you do, paint the whole leaf green, on one side. It's okay if the layer isn't even, I think that adds to it.

When you are done, let it dry completely.
