CROWDSOURCING

I own a small company that makes clothes. Last year, many of my customers suggested that I start making clothes for children. However, I really don't have much experience with children. Because my business is so small, I didn't have the money to hire an employee with the right experience, so when a friend suggested crowdsourcing, I decided to try it. The Internet makes it easy to connect with different kinds of people all over the world. Crowdsourcing is a way of getting information, ideas, opinions, and even work from these different kinds of people, usually through the Internet or some kind of app. It's different from outsourcing, which often means a company pays one group of people to complete one type of task for them. For example, I could have another company cut all of my materials so I don't have to do it myself. Crowdsourcing, on the other hand, allows you use the experience and knowledge of different kinds of people to improve or create something new. This usually results in more and better ideas. Instead of hiring just one expert for a specific job, a company can pay many different experts with different experiences and opinions. Companies can also use crowdsourcing to get opinions about new products from their customers. With crowdsourcing, they can reach millions of customers all over the world.

Crowdsourcing isn't just for hiring work or creating products. Traffic apps use crowdsourcing to collect driving information and improve the experience for their users. There are many other ways in which crowdsourcing is used to create collections of information provided by volunteers. For example, a fire in September 2018 destroyed millions of items in a natural history museum in Brazil. The items are lost forever, but they can still be remembered through photos. So, a website and a local university are using crowdsourcing to collect photos of the items from the museum's collection. People from all over the world can share their photos. It would be impossible for one person to provide photos of the whole collection, but with crowdsourcing it becomes possible.

Crowdsourcing helped me finally start selling a few children's clothing items. I held a competition to get ideas from a variety of different people, and I used the most popular ones—of course, I paid the winners for their ideas. It worked so well that I'm going to do it again in a few months! There are so many experts out there, why don't you try crowdsourcing to connect with them?
