In America, the last Thursday in November is Thanksgiving. It is a well-known holiday. People travel to be with their families and friends and to enjoy a special Thanksgiving meal. In New York there is the Macy's Thanksgiving parade. More than 2 million people attend the parade and people all over America watch it on television.

The turkey is the symbol of Thanksgiving and it is sometimes called Turkey Day. This is because the traditional dinner is roast turkey with lots of vegetables.

Americans love eating turkey. Nowadays they eat twice as much turkey as they did 20 years ago – the average American eats 8.5 kilograms of turkey each year. 45 million turkeys live on factory farms. Many people think that factory farming is cruel. Up to 25,000 birds live in one shed.

About 100 years ago wild turkeys in America were nearly extinct because people destroyed the forests to build houses. Now, there are conservation programs to bring turkeys back. In 1959 there were 450,000 wild turkeys. In 1990 there were 3.5 million. Benjamin Franklin (a founding father of the United States) loved wild turkeys. He wanted the wild turkey to be the symbol of America (instead of the eagle).
