M. J. McGrath’s new mystery novel, *The Boy in the Snow*, takes us to beautiful Alaska. The main character is a smart, half-native Alaskan, half-outsider woman named Edie Kiglatuk. In this book, Kiglatuk has traveled far south from her home on Ellesmere Island near the North Pole to help her ex-husband run in Alaska’s famous dog sled race, the Iditarod.

At the beginning of the book, Kiglatuk discovers the body of a dead baby who was left in a forest outside Anchorage, Alaska. Kiglatuk makes her way throughout Alaska trying to solve the mystery of the baby’s death. During Kiglatuk’s travels, McGrath describes Alaska’s wilderness and animals in great detail. We read of its frozen tundra and huge ice fields, freezing wind storms, and thick forests. We meet bears and foxes, eagles and wolves. We also come across many different types of people: Russian Old Believers, Washington-dreaming politicians, hard-working native Alaskans, kind-hearted waitresses and dishonest businessmen.
