

TRANSPORT VOCABULARY

Journey: A trip or voyage from one place to another.

Platform: A raised level surface on which people or things can stand.

Board: To get on a plane, train, or ship.

Return ticket: A ticket that allows a passenger to travel to a destination and back.

Hail: To signal or call for a taxi or other form of transportation.

Commute: To travel regularly between one's home and place of work or study.

Carpool: To share a car with others when traveling to work or other destinations.

Airline: A company that provides air transportation for passengers.

Boarding pass: A card or document that allows a passenger to board a plane or other form of transportation.

Flight attendant: A person who assists passengers on a plane.

Aisle: A passage between rows of seats in a plane, train, or other form of transportation.

Gate: The area where passengers wait to board a plane or other form of transportation.

Customs: The place where passports and other documents are checked when entering or leaving a country.

Delayed: When a flight or other form of transportation is behind schedule.

Baggage claim: The area where passengers pick up their luggage after a flight or other form of transportation.

Fasten: To secure a seatbelt or other safety device.

Take off: The moment when a plane or other form of transportation leaves the ground.

Check in: The process of registering as a passenger for a flight or other form of transportation.

Runway: The area where planes take off and land.

Overhead bin: The storage compartment above the seats on a plane.

Freight: Goods transported by truck, train, ship, or plane.

Carousel: The rotating conveyor belt where luggage is placed for passengers to pick up after a flight.

Cruise: A journey by sea, visiting different places, especially as a holiday/vacation.

Deck: The level surface of a ship or boat.

Pier: A structure built out from the shore into the water, used as a landing place for boats.

Porter: A person employed to carry luggage and other loads.
