LIFE OF FISH

Fish often hide their eggs because many other animals like to eat fish eggs. Some species of shark lay their eggs in a hard egg case to keep the eggs safe (3) [] they hatch.

Life is very dangerous for young fish. (4) [] of them can't swim well. They often float into colder water or places where there's no food. A large female tuna fish can lay up to six million eggs at one time, but only about two of these will grow (7) [] adult tuna.
