HALLOWEEN

It's a time to honour our **ancestors** and loved ones who are no longer with us. Many people visit cemeteries to clean and decorate graves and light candles in memory of the dead. It's a day to reflect on the cycle of life and death, remembering those we've lost.

So, as the end of October and the beginning of November approach, remember that this season is not just about costumes and candy. It's also a time to remember our past, both the saintly and the dearly departed. Whether you're having a blast on Halloween or taking a moment for reflection on All Saints Day and All Souls Day, this time of year is a special blend of fun and respect that brings people together in their own unique ways.
