The Beatles

In the 1960s, the Beatles were probably the most famous pop group in the whole world. They were four boys from the north of England and none of them had any training in music. They started by performing and recording songs by black Americans and they had some success with these songs. The Beatles did not have a long career. Their first hit record was in 1963 and they split up in 1970. clothes as souvenirs! However, today some of their songs remain as famous as they were when they first came out. Throughout the world, many people can sing part of a Beatles song if you ask them.
