THERE IS/ THERE ARE

We use **THERE IS** (singular) or **THERE ARE** (plurals) to express the existence of an object in a place.

AFFIRMATIVES



There is a bed in Lisa's bedroom.
There's a picture on the wall.

NEGATIVES



There are not armchairs in Bart's bedroom.
There aren't books in Bart's bedroom.

QUESTIONS



Is there a bed in Maggie's bedroom?
Yes, there is. // No, there isn't.

Are there toys in Maggie's bedroom?
Yes, there are // No, there aren't.
