The way people raise cows and other animals for meat is an ethical and environmental issue. Is it OK for cows to be on feedlots? Or are large pastures better? Feedlots are dirt and manure¹-covered areas. The areas are separated by fences and have feeding troughs—containers for cows to eat from several times a day. Large pastures are grass-covered land that cows can graze² on freely.

Both feedlots and pastures have their problems. On feedlots, cows eat grain. Growing grain takes up land, water, and energy to harvest. Transporting the grain from the farm to the feedlot also uses up fossil fuels. Large pastures take up a lot of land, plus the cows produce gas which can pollute the air.

Some farmers are trying “managed grazing.” They use one section of a large pasture and place moveable fences around it. The cows graze in this section for a few weeks, and then the fences and cows are moved to another section. Once the cows leave, the grass has a chance to grow back, and the manure that the cows left behind makes the dirt better able to grow plants.

Managed grazing still requires a large amount of land, but the land can be used more efficiently. It provides a natural diet for the cows (grass) and a natural fertilizer (manure) for the farmer to use. This idea may not work for every farmer. But it is great to see people looking for ethical and environmentally-friendly ways to raise cows.
