

I GRAMMAR. 2nd and 3rd conditionals

Second conditional

<i>If + past simple ⇒ would</i>	If he knew the answer, he would tell us.
<i>If + past simple ⇒ modal verb</i>	If they weren't busy, they might help us.

Нереальна ситуація в теперішньому часі. Підрядне речення передає уявну ситуацію (**якщо б**), що суперечить фактам в теперішньому часі, тому така ситуація неможлива або маловірогідна в теперішньому або майбутньому часі.

Third conditional

<i>If + past perfect ⇒ would + have + past participle</i>	If I had known the truth, I wouldn't have trusted him.
<i>If + past perfect ⇒ modal verb + have + past participle</i>	If she hadn't taken a map, she might have got lost.

Нереальна ситуація в минулому та її **нереальні наслідки**, тобто ця уявна ситуація так і не відбулася.
