

# Subject and verb – autumn sentences

**Subject:** (the person, place, or thing)

**Verb:** A verb shows **the action** (read, walk, run, learn), or **state of being** (is, am, are, was, were) in the sentence.

Ask: ***what is happening in this sentence, what is the subject doing?***

1. Autumn comes after winter.	
<b>Subject</b>	<b>Verb</b>

2. The months are March, April and May.	
<b>Subject</b>	<b>Verb</b>

3. Daylight saving finishes.	
<b>Subject</b>	<b>Verb</b>

4. In autumn, the nights get colder.	
<b>Subject</b>	<b>Verb</b>

5. We pick the last summer vegetables.	
<b>Subject</b>	<b>Verb</b>

6. We freeze the vegetables.	
<b>Subject</b>	<b>Verb</b>

7. Some people swim at the beach.	
<b>Subject</b>	<b>Verb</b>

8. The water is colder.

9. The trees change colour.
