## Object pronouns

Me, you, him, her, it, us, them

Listen to                      (Kate)  
Give                      the pencil. I want it back.  
You can visit                      (Tom and John) next week.  
Look at                      (I and Jane).  
Don't forget to take                      (the phone) when it rings.



## Possessive adjectives and pronouns.

In front of the noun	Alone

<b>My</b> dog	<b>Mine</b>
<b>Your</b> dinner	<b>your</b>
<b>Her</b> cat	<b>Hers</b>
<b>His</b> ball	<b>His</b>
<b>Its</b> mouse	<b>its</b>
<b>Our</b> home	<b>Ours</b>
<b>Your</b> car	<b>Yours</b>
<b>Their</b> book	<b>theirs</b>

Eks: My sister think that it is her book, but it is mine (she/I)

Have you met grandfather (**they**)

parents say that it is garden (**she/they**)

It wasn't mistake, it was (**I, they**)

It isn't car, it is (**he/she**)

brother thinks the car is (**I, he**)

car wasn't working, so I used (**I, he**)

house is smaller than (**we, their**)

The ticket belongs to Tina. It is (**she**)

You know it is not money, it is (**you, I**)
