 metre /'mi:tə/ (n) My father is two metres tall.

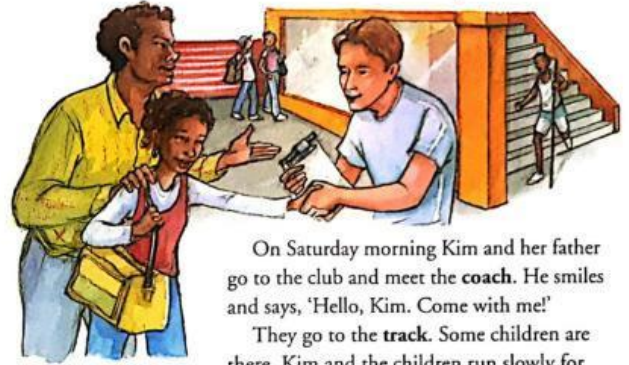
'Oh, yes, please!' Kim answers. She is twelve, and this is her first year at this school.

That evening Kim asks her father, 'Can I go to Allen's Athletics Club on Saturday?'

Her father looks at her. 'This is new!' he says. 'OK, you can go.'

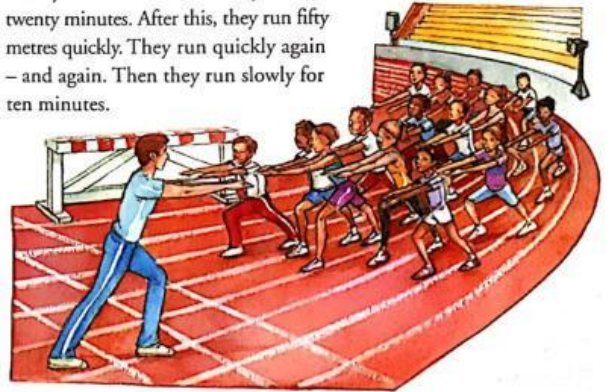


club /kɪb/ (n) Children come to the club and play after school.



On Saturday morning Kim and her father go to the club and meet the **coach**. He smiles and says, 'Hello, Kim. Come with me!'

They go to the **track**. Some children are there. Kim and the children run slowly for twenty **minutes** and then they **stretch** for twenty minutes. After this, they run fifty metres quickly. They run quickly again – and again. Then they run slowly for ten minutes.



coach /kəʊtʃ/ (n) He works in an office but at weekends he is a football coach.
 track /træk/ (n) The new track is open and I run there.
 minute /'mɪnɪt/ (n) She only waits five minutes. Then she goes away.
 stretch /stretʃ/ (v) I stretch and then I get up.



Kim's father asks, 'Do you like it here?'

'Yes!' Kim answers.

Kim's father takes her to the athletics club every week. He watches her. 'She's very good,' he thinks.



There are often **races** at the club and sometimes Kim **wins** them. Her father is happy then.

After six weeks the coach says, 'There's a **competition** at Barton Athletics Club on Saturday. Can you go? Ask your mother and father.'

That afternoon Kim talks to her mother and father about the competition. Her friend Hannah is there.

'Come shopping with me on Saturday!' Hannah says.

'Competitions are very important,' Kim's father says.

'Sorry, Hannah,' Kim says.



race /reɪs/ (n) Every year there is a bicycle **race** across the town.

win /waɪn/ (v) We **win** every game.

competition /ˌkɒmpɪtɪʃən/ (n) This is my story for the **competition** in the newspaper.



On Saturday Kim's father drives her to the competition. There are children there from Barton Athletics Club.

Kim's first race is at ten o'clock. One girl is tall and strong. Kim looks at her. Suddenly, Kim hears the **gun**. The tall girl starts quickly. She wins, and Kim is **third**.



gun /ɡʌn/ (n) The man has a **gun**! Run!
third /θɜːd/ (adj) I like two of the bedrooms, but the **third** bedroom is very small.

The **second** race is at twelve o'clock. The tall girl is there again – and again she wins.

In the third race Kim starts very quickly, and she wins. She is very happy. Her father says, 'Good girl!'



second /ˈsekənd/ (adj) His first film is good, but I don't like his **second** film.

'George, stop,' her mother says. 'Time for bed, Kim.'

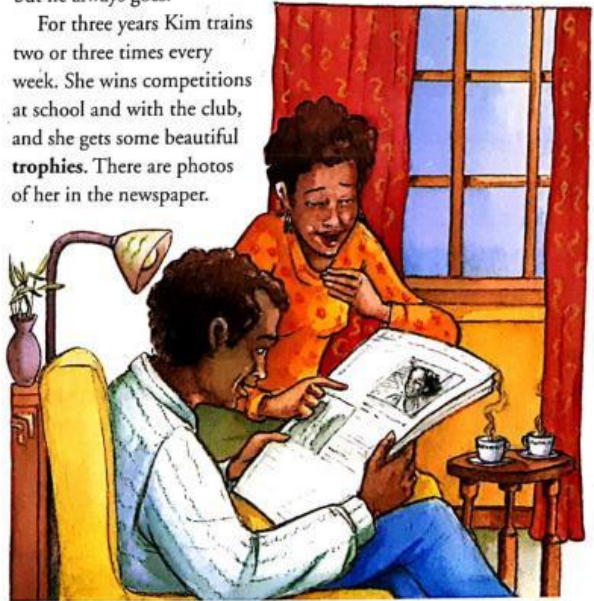

For three years Kim trains two or three times every week. She wins competitions at school and with the club, and she gets some beautiful **trophies**. There are photos of her in the newspaper.



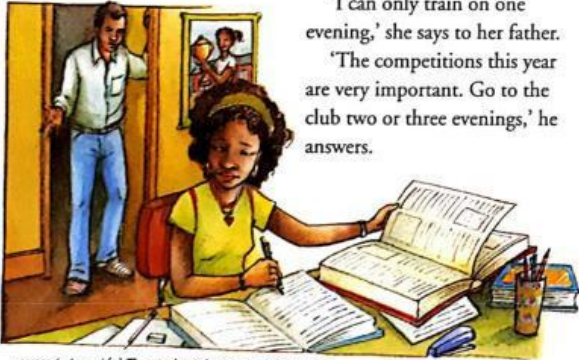
runner /ˈrʌnə/ (n) There are only four **runners**. Can I run too?

Then Kim has a difficult year at school. She is sixteen and she has important **exams** in the summer. She wants some time with her friends too.

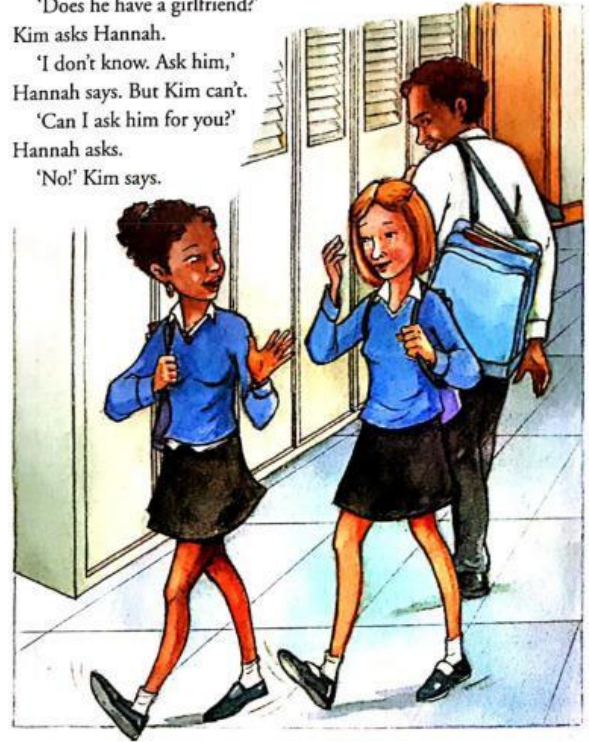


'I can only train on one evening,' she says to her father.

'When is the disco?' Kim asks Curtis.

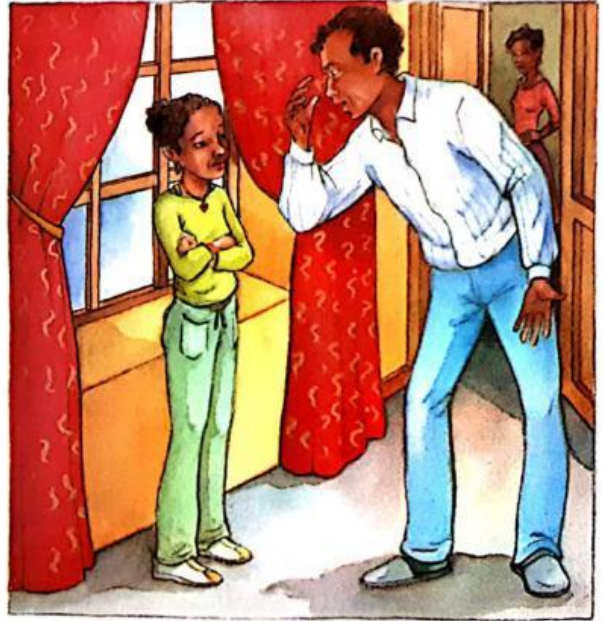
'Friday, 29th,' Curtis says.

At home her father is angry. 'You can't go to the disco. You can't run well after a late night,' he says.

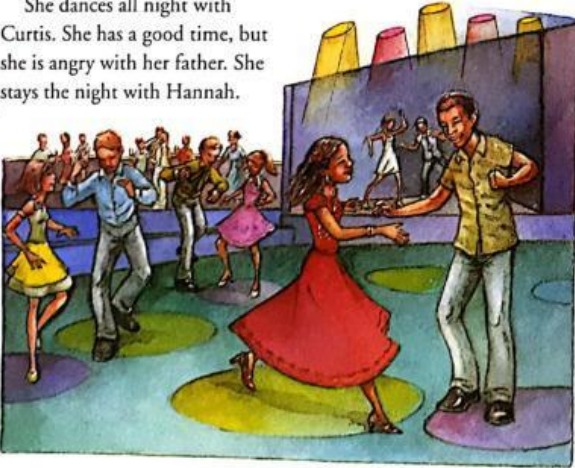




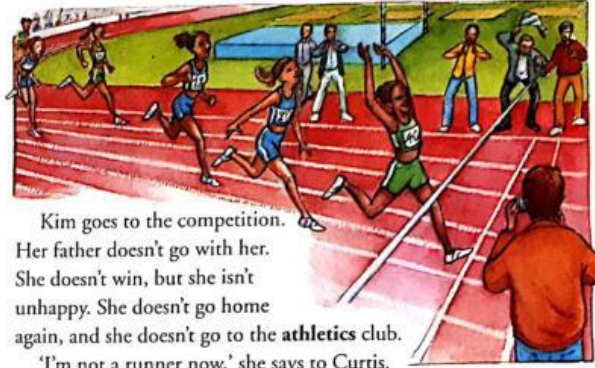
It is June 29th. Kim is putting on a long red dress.
