A word that can take the place of a noun.

Verbs, Adverbs and Adjectives

Verb

An action word, e.g. jump.

Adverb

A word that describes a verb or adjective, e.g. quickly.

Adjective

A word that describes a noun, e.g. happy.

Conjunction

A word that joins words, phrases and clauses.

Interjection

A word that expresses an emotion or feeling.
