While archaeologists were excavating at the future site of a 16-story hotel in London, they discovered a 1,800-year-old statue of an eagle with a snake in its beak. The statue was carved in stone and stands two feet (65 centimeters) tall. The right wing has broken off from the body, but other than that, the sculpture is intact, not missing any other pieces. Experts believe the sculpture was a decoration for the tomb of a wealthy Roman official or merchant.

When the statue was first carved, London was part of the Roman Empire and was called Londinium. It was a walled city along the River Thames, with a population of about 30,000. The tomb that the statue came from was probably next to a road leading out of the city. Today the neighborhood is near the Tower of London.

The sculpture is an amazing piece of art—the finest work ever discovered in London. In its day, it would have been a symbol of wealth and culture. According to Roman mythology, people believed that the eagle carried the soul of a dead person to heaven. So the eagle statue is a sign that even in the distant city of Londinium, the person who died knew the customs and beliefs of the people who lived in Rome.
