

Question 5.1

This question is about intellectual property issues. You will hear **two** excerpts of soundtrack music.

The first excerpt 'Powerhouse' was composed by Raymond Scott in 1937.

The second excerpt 'Main Title from Honey, I Shrunk The Kids' was composed by James Horner in 1989.

Musically there is a strong resemblance between 'Powerhouse' and "Main Title from Honey, I Shrunk The Kids". Scott's piece was used without payment or credit in the feature film leading his estate to threaten legal action against the Disney Corporation.

The Disney Corporation did not pay credit to or initially get the rights from the Scott estate in order to reference the song, so they had to settle out of court for an undisclosed amount of money.
