


RANKING AND COMPARISON

The graph below shows the types of transport used by tourists who visited New Zealand from five countries in 2004.



The bar chart illustrates information about the **number/ proportion** of people from five countries who **chose/ choosing** different means of transport when they **visited/ visiting** New Zealand in 2004.

In general/ generally, as can/ as it can be seen from the graph, travelling by car was the most popular among people from **almost countries/ almost all countries**, with an **except/ exception** of Japan, whose people preferred air travel the most.

In/ With detail, as **for/ with** travelling by air and coach, **headed/ top** the list were Japanese tourists, with **rough/ more than** 50% for both. Next, British people **ranked/ ranking** second **on/ of** the list of car users at roughly 35% although Korean visitors were **on/ in** second place in terms of travelling by coach, at 40%.

With respect **for/ to** cars, top **on/ of** the list was British people, with up to 60% **chose/ choosing** this means of transportation. In contrast, the figure **with/ for** the Japanese was **bottom/ low** of the list, with **mere/ a mere** 25%. The others ranged between **45 to/ and just over/ higher** 50%.

As **regards/ regard** travelling by ferry, the figure for German tourists came first **at/ on** the list, although it was **noticeable/ noticeably** higher **as/ in** opposed to British, at just under 50% and **approximate/ approximately** 35% in turn.
