The henna plant has been used to decorate the body for thousands of years. The earliest evidence of this comes from Egyptian mummies 1- (who- whose -which) hair and nails were stained with henna. Henna 2- (had been used– used – was used) in Ancient Egypt before it spread in other countries. It 3-(had been – was- were) a popular adornment for the rich and was also used by the poor to decorate their bodies 4-(because- however- yet) they could not afford jewellery.

Henna paste was originally 5-(leave – leaving -left) on the palms and soles of the feet for its cooling effect, 6-(but – not – because) as the paste comes away it leaves a stain on the skin – this probably sparked the idea of using henna for beautification. Henna is used for special occasions the most popular of 7- (who – which – whom) is the Henna Night where the bride, her family, relatives, and friends get together to celebrate the wedding to come. Tradition suggests that for 8-(as long as – as a consequence – as a result) the henna stain appears on the bride, she 9- (didn't -doesn't – does) have to do any housework! Also, the darker the stain, the better the marriage! 10- (So- Moreover – Since) you can imagine why the bride would want the stain to come out dark and last as long as possible.
