



The worker bee uses its long tongue called a proboscis to slurp the nectar.

Worker bees can fly for miles to find the right flower.

The worker bee swallows the nectar down and store it in a special extra stomach. In this special stomach the nectar is transformed into honey.

The younger bee empties its stomach in one of the honeycomb cells.

The worker bee empties its stomach into the mouth of a younger bee.

The younger bee fan (asciugano) the fresh nectar with the wings to dry it out.

Worker bees go back to their hive.

The little bee closes the cell with beewax (cera d'api).
