Word	Meaning	Example
spaghetti (n) /spə'geti/	a kind of pasta made in a form of long, thin pieces	Let's make spaghetti and meatballs for dinner.
milliliter (n) /'mili,li:tər/ abbreviation ml UK millilitre	a unit for measuring liquids such as water, milk, oil, etc.	Can you help me put 250 milliliters of milk into the bowl, please?
lemon (n) /'lemən/	a fruit that has yellow skin and very sour juice	Would you like lemon or apple juice?
gram (n) /græm/ abbreviation g UK gramme	a unit for measuring weight	Put 300 grams of rice in the cooker.
tablespoon (n) /'teɪblspu:n/ abbreviation tbsp	a large spoon that you use for measuring or serving food	Don't forget to add 2 tablespoons of sugar to the lemon juice.
onion (n) /'ʌnjən/	a round vegetable with a strong flavor and many layers on the inside	Do you cry while you are cutting onions?
teaspoon (n) /'ti:spu:n/ abbreviation tsp	a small spoon that we use for measuring food or stirring tea or coffee in a cup	How many teaspoons of salt do I need to put into this soup?
tomato (n) /tə'metəʊ/	a round, soft fruit that people usually eat as a vegetable or make salad and sauce from them	We need some tomatoes for the sauce.
flour (n) /'flaʊər/	a kind of powder made from grain that people use for making cakes, bread, etc.	One of the main ingredients for making cakes is flour.

Grammar

Quantifiers with **much** and **many**

We use **much** or **many** to talk about quantities or amounts of something.

▲ We use **much** before uncountable nouns (sugar, water, milk, oil, flour, spaghetti, etc.)

Much

There isn't **much** flour left to make a cake.

Please don't put too **much** butter on my sandwich.

How much sugar do you need? - One kilo, please.

**Many**

▲ We use **many** before countable nouns (eggs, tomatoes, onions, lemons, etc.)

There are **many** apples on the tables.

We don't have **many** onions left in the fridge.

How many tomatoes do you have? - Ten.


