



3: Argentinian Choripan



The Argentinian choripan is street food, like the Vietnamese banh mi sandwich. You can buy it from vendors (sellers) when walking or driving.

It is a simple sandwich of chorizo (spicy sausage) and a bun. A bun is a small bread made to hold a single sandwich.

First, they put butter on the bun. Then they toast it to make it brown and hot. They cut the sausage in half, so it fits and doesn't fall out. Then they add toppings, like salsa, green onions, and chilis.
