2 have = have got

We can use *have* in the same way as we use *have got* (► Unit 42.2)

- to talk about possessions:

Nicolas Cage has an island in the Caribbean. Do you have a lot of money? Switzerland doesn't have a coast.

- to talk about your friends or family:

Nicolas has a son. How many children do you have?

- to describe what somebody looks like:

I have dark hair and brown eyes.

- to talk about illnesses:

I have a cold/headache. Do you have a temperature?

⚠ *X Have eighteen years old. ✓ I am eighteen years old.*

⚠ When *have* = *have got*, we don't use it in continuous tenses:

X I'm having two sisters. ✓ I have two sisters.

3 have for doing things

We also use *have* to talk about things we do. We cannot use *have got* in this way:

<i>have +</i>	<i>a shower/a bath/a wash/a shave/a haircut</i>
	<i>breakfast/lunch/dinner/a meal/a snack/a drink/a cup of coffee</i>
	<i>fun/a good time/a party/a holiday/a celebration</i>
	<i>an argument/an accident/a bad time</i>

We can use *have* for doing things in the present continuous or the present simple:
Listen to that noise! The neighbours are having a party! I always have a good time at parties.
