

9 Read the box. Say the examples in your language.

Type 0: if + present simple → present simple

Use: to talk about general truths or things that always happen.

If you mix red and white, you get pink.

Type 1: if + present simple → will + infinitive without to

Use: to talk about things that are likely to happen in the future.

If he comes late, we won't go out.

Note: unless (= if not) *Unless he comes early, we won't go out.*

10 Put the verbs in brackets into the *present simple* or the *future simple*. What type of conditional is each sentence?

- 1 If you heat ice, it (melt).
- 2 If the weather is fine, we (go) to the park.
- 3 If I go to London, I (visit) the Tower of London.
- 4 If you mix red and yellow, you (get) orange.
- 5 If you don't water plants, they (die).
- 6 If we don't leave now, we (miss) the plane!
