

9 Read the box. Say the examples in your language.

Type 0: *if* + present simple → present simple

Use: to talk about general truths or things that always happen.

*If you **mix** red and white, you **get** pink.*

Type 1: *if* + present simple → *will* + infinitive without *to*

Use: to talk about things that are likely to happen in the future.

*If he **comes** late, we **won't go** out.*

Note: *unless* (= if not) *Unless he comes early, we won't go out.*

10 Put the verbs in brackets into the *present simple* or the *future simple*. What type of conditional is each sentence?

- 1 If you heat ice, it (**melt**).
- 2 If the weather is fine, we (**go**) to the park.
- 3 If I go to London, I (**visit**) the Tower of London.
- 4 If you mix red and yellow, you (**get**) orange.
- 5 If you don't water plants, they (**die**).
- 6 If we don't leave now, we (**miss**) the plane!
