## Watch and **Learn**

Eating out can cost five times more than eating at home, so it's never been a better time to learn how to cook. However, cooking classes aren't exactly cheap either. In some cities it can cost around \$90 per person for a two-hour lesson. So, if you want to eat well and save money, what can you do? Turn on your TV! While it may seem like most of today's cooking shows are all about competition and difficult dishes, you can still find many extremely helpful shows to teach you the simple art of cooking.

Of course, cooking shows are nothing new. In the 1960s, Julia Child hosted one of America's first cooking shows, *The French Chef*. At the time, many Americans thought French food was expensive and difficult to cook. But Child taught viewers it was possible to make many French dishes at home, and she wasn't afraid to make a mess doing it. The show was so popular, it continued for ten seasons, and old episodes were still playing on American TV as recently as 2017!

*The French Chef* isn't the only old cooking show that you can still find on TV. Want to learn how to make pasta or authentic Italian pizza? There are some great shows from the 1970s, 80s, and 90s with simple, step-by-step cooking instructions. Want to learn how to cook traditional dishes from the American South, like hush puppies or gumbo? There was a show for that, too, and if you turn your TV to the right channel, you can still find it. And if the food isn't enough to attract you to these old shows, the colorful clothes and wild hairstyles from the 70s, 80s, and 90s will be!

Of course, in the age of the Internet, TV isn't the only place to find cooking shows. Some of today's best cooking shows are online. In fact, if you want to learn how to cook a dish from another country—Japanese udon, English pasties, Ethiopian injera—the Internet is the place to go. Or maybe you want to learn how to make a dish from your favorite book, movie, or TV show. There's an online cooking show that can teach you how.

So, competition may seem popular at the moment, but it isn't the only option for cooking shows. Some of the first shows are still playing after 50 years, and over 6 million people have watched episodes of the best online shows. With recommendations like that, avoid the expensive restaurants, skip the \$90 cooking lesson, and just turn on your TV or computer and start learning how to cook!
