

Word order

Words **both** and **together**.

Read these rules and the examples.

Both goes after be:

*We're **both** very busy in the week.*

Both goes before other verbs:

*We **both** like the same bands.*

Together is usually at the end of the sentence:

*We watch DVDs **together**.*

Read about Laurent and Larry again. Highlight all the examples of **both** and **together**.



Frequency adverbs and time expressions

Frequency adverbs (**always**, etc.) go **after** be and **before** other verbs:

*Larry's is **always** late.*

*We **usually** go to concerts together.*

Phrases with **every** are usually at the end of the sentence:

*He eats burgers and chips **every day**.*

Read about Laurent and Larry again. Highlight all the examples of **frequency adverbs** and phrases with **every**.
