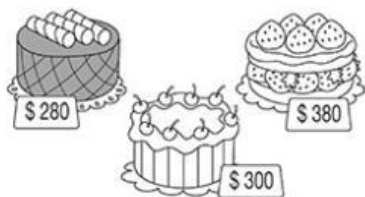


Comparisons long adjectives (more / most)

1-syllable adjectives

'the ~~most~~ fattest'.

2-syllable adjectives

polite	more polite	most polite
helpful	more helpful	most helpful
exception: adjectives ending in y, ow, le		
heavy	heavier	heaviest
narrow	narrower	narrowest
simple	simpler	simplest

3-syllable adjectives

expensive	more expensive	most expensive
delicious	more delicious	most delicious
popular	more popular	most popular
