


Multiple Meaning Words

Read the definitions for each word below. Then, decide which definition of the word is contained in each sentence or group of sentences. Then, write either a 1, 2, or 3 on the line next to each paragraph.

Duck 1: *Noun* any of various typically web-footed swimming birds with the neck and legs short, the body heavy, the bill often broad and flat, and the males and females usually differing in color; *also* : the flesh of a duck used as food

Duck 2: *Verb*, to move quickly : disappear suddenly

Duck 3: *Verb* to evade a duty, question, or responsibility :

Check 1: *Noun* a written order directing a bank to pay money as instructed.

Check 2: *Noun* a mark typically placed beside an item to show it is correct.

Check 3: *Verb* to look over and verify that something is done correctly.

Check 4: *Noun* a slip indicating the amount due or a bill.

Market 1: *Noun*, a retail establishment usually of a specified kind.

Market 2: *Verb*, to sell or commercialize an item or product.

Tunnel 1: *Noun* a passage that goes through a solid place like ground or a mountain.

Tunnel 2: *Verb* to create a passage through a place like ground or a mountain.

____ 7. The termites **tunneled** through the wood floors in the house.

____ 8. Allison **tunneled** through the massive crowd of students in the cafeteria.

____ 9. Allison drove through the **tunnel** in San Dia Mountain.

Pupil 1: *Noun*, the hole in the center of the eye that allows light into the retina.

Pupil 2: *Noun*, a student.

____ 10. Brad and Jonathan are both **pupils** at the same school.

____ 11. Brad created a model of the eye including a **pupil** for the science fair.

____ 12. ____ 13. Mrs. Johnson's **pupils** watched her **pupils** complete their assignment.

Mold 1: *Noun*, an empty container designed to give a particular shape to liquid after it hardens into the shape of the container.

Mold 2: *Noun*, a fungus.

Mold 3: *Verb*, to give shape to a flexible object through kneading or other forms of pressure.

____ 14. The artist is trying to **mold** the clay into the form of a ballet dancer.

____ 15. **Mold** grew on the artist's orange that was left on the counter for four weeks.

____ 16. The dentist poured a thick liquid into the **mold** of my teeth .

Staple 1: *Noun*, a metal fastener used to hold things together.

Staple 2: *Verb*, the act of fastening things together

Staple 3: *Noun*, a raw material that has a constant demand, or is always needed.
