PRESENT SIMPLE

PRESENT PROGRESSIVE

PAST SIMPLE

PRESENT PERFECT SIMPLE

PAST PERFECT SIMPLE

5. Before I met my current roommate, I (live) with someone I wasn't related to.

FUTURE “WILL”

1. I(call) you as soon as I arrive at the airport tomorrow.
2. She is feeling better, so she(attend) the meeting next week.
3. We(have) a picnic in the park if the weather is nice on Saturday.
4. He(start) a new job next month and is excited about the opportunity.
5. If you study hard, you(pass) the exam with flying colors.

FUTURE “GOING TO”

1. I(visit) my grandparents next weekend because I miss them.
2. We(buy) a new car later this year since our old one is unreliable.
3. Sarah(start) a photography course next month to pursue her passion.
4. They(renovate) their kitchen soon to create a more modern space.
5. I am not feeling well, so I(see) the doctor tomorrow for a check-up.

FUTURE PERFECT SIMPLE

1. By the time you arrive, we(finish) preparing dinner.
2. She is confident that she(complete) the project by the deadline.
3. We(live) in this city for five years by the end of next month.
4. By the time the guests arrive, we(decorate) the entire venue.
5. I'm sure he(read) the book before the book club meeting on Friday.
