



Homonyms

Homonyms are sets of words that are pronounced the same but have different meanings. Homonyms usually come in pairs such as ate and eight but may come in sets of three such as to, too, and two. Below are a few homonym pairs that are common in writing.

air	heir
bald	bawled
bear	bare
berry	bury
peal	peel
pore	pour
boar	bore
blue	blew
bough	bow
principle	principal
