Try pudding. Would you like egg or plum?

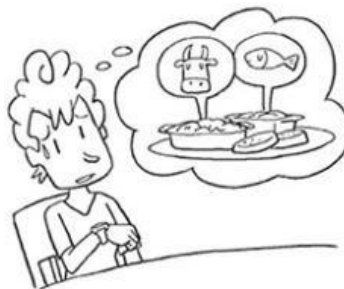
I'd like plum pudding. Yum, yum, yum!
